Please note:

These following data are not based on a scientific sample.

Because we used a convenience sample, it would be methodologically inappropriate to conduct regression analysis or attempt to calculate error.



Survey Review: Methodology

On November 8th, the survey went live online.

- A postcard was mailed to every District resident household in English and Spanish
- Email and automated call was sent to all District parents/guardians in English and Spanish
- Survey information/link shared on District and school social media sites (including Spanish Facebook page)
- Paper copies of the survey were made available at all District schools and District office in English and Spanish
- Press release sent to local media Press Gazette, WFRV, WHBY, and WLUK ran stories with survey link
- Survey information on website prominent on home page

The survey closed on November 23, 2016.

There were a total of 2,990 completed responses. This included 27 Spanish surveys.

In addition to providing results for all survey respondents, I also included a comparison group that is comprised of respondents who indicated that they do not have children who currently attend or have attended a Green Bay Area Public School District school, do not live in the district community, and are not district employees.
